Our term has already started in a really positive way, and it is our delight to be able to now share with you the final report following our Ofsted inspection at the end of last term. Below you will see a letter from Mrs Stacey and Mr Fry which sets out the outcome of the report (which is attached to this letter), and we believe that it is important that they are the ones that share this news with you.

"Dear Parents and carers,

Following our recent Ofsted inspection in November, we are delighted to announce that St Mary Redcliffe

Primary has been graded as GOOD across all areas of the framework. The school has been on a journey of
improvement since 2016 and, since joining DBAT and the formation of our Academy Council in 2017, the school has
made huge strides to improve the quality of education for our children.

As new leaders, we appreciate how much change there has been in the school during the past 5 years. This has certainly not been an easy journey but through the continued support from the community, the Academy Council and the Trust, and a highly dedicated teaching team our school has been able to improve. The report states that "there is a strong sense of community and belonging at the school" and "the school's vision of rooted in love is central to life at St Mary Redcliffe". We are incredibly proud that our school's ethos has been recognised and, despite all the challenges that Covid has thrown at us, we have remained strong as a community to enable our children to thrive.

The feedback from the inspection highlighted those areas of development from the previous report have been addressed and are now areas of strength in the school. As you are aware, reading has been a key focus for the school and we are pleased that the inspectors commented on the strong reading culture at SMR. Furthermore, the report states that children feel safe and enjoy coming to school.

As a leadership team we felt that the inspection was a fair and positive process and reflects us well as a school. Since our last inspection, there has been a huge amount of work around our curriculum intent, implementation and impact. To build on this further, we are now reviewing our curriculum to ensure that all leaders across the school have a secure understanding of the foundations to learning in the early years.

As a school we are immensely proud of all the hard work that children, staff, parents, Academy Council members, the Trust and the wider community have undertaken that has enabled us to make this progress since 2016. We thank you for your continued support, it is greatly appreciated and we look forward to continuing our journey of improvement.
