What was life like for an evacuee in WWII?



History Knowledge

- World War II started after Germany began invading Czechoslovakia and Poland.
- Neville Chamberlain warned Adolf Hitler that if he did not stop a war would begin. Adolf Hitler said he would stop but he did not. Neville Chamberlain announced that the United Kingdom was at war with Germany on 3rd September 1939.
- The United Kingdom's main allies were the United States of America. China and the Soviet Union (Russia). However, other allies joined us during the war: France, India, Canada and Australia.
- All children (who lived in cities) were evacuated to different parts of the countryside (without their parents) so that they would be safe until the war ended.
- On the 8th May 1945, Germany announced their surrender and victory had been won in Europe.
