## **RE** knowledge


- Christians believe the 'big story' of **The Bible** is that God saves people. This **salvation** includes the ongoing restoration of humans' relationship with God.
- The New Testament says that Jesus' death was somehow 'for us'.
- Christians interpret this death in a variety of ways: for example, as a **sacrifice** for sin; as a victory over sin, death and the devil; paying the punishment as a substitute for everyone's sins; rescuing the lost and leading them to God; leading from darkness to light, from slavery to freedom.
- Christians believe that Jesus calls them to sacrifice their own needs to the needs of others, and some are prepared to die for others and for their faith.

The Bible	The Holy Book of Christianity.
Eucharist	A ritual that takes place in churches to remember Jesus' sacrifice to human beings by eating bread and drinking wine to represent Jesus' body and blood.
Gospels	The Books of the New Testament that tell the story of Jesus' life and teachings.
The New Testament	The part of the Bible that tells the story after the birth of Jesus Christ.
Resurrec- tion	How Jesus was brought back to life after his death.
Sacrifice	To give up something for someone else.
Salvation	To be saved from harm.
