This unit explores the sacrifices that Christians believe that Jesus made in order to save humanity



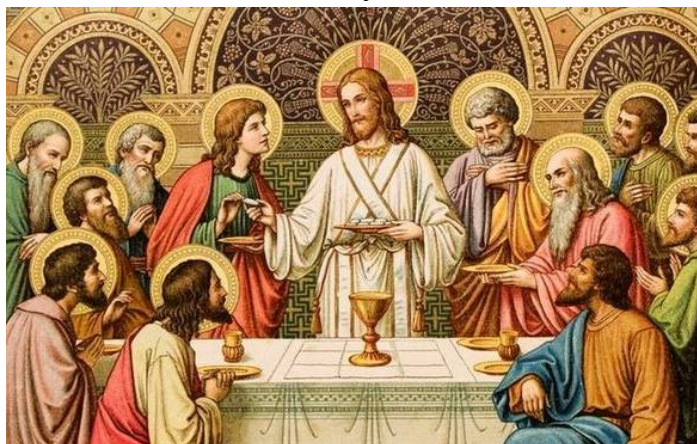
## RE knowledge

- ◇ Christians believe the 'big story' of **The Bible** is that God saves people. This **salvation** includes the ongoing restoration of humans' relationship with God.
- ◇ **The New Testament** says that Jesus' death was somehow 'for us'.
- ◇ Christians interpret this death in a variety of ways: for example, as a **sacrifice** for sin; as a victory over sin, death and the devil; paying the punishment as a substitute for everyone's sins; rescuing the lost and leading them to God; leading from darkness to light, from slavery to freedom.
- ◇ Christians believe that Jesus calls them to sacrifice their own needs to the needs of others, and some are prepared to die for others and for their faith.

## What did Jesus do to save human beings ?



At the last supper Jesus ate bread and wine and instructed his disciples to do the same in memory of him.



## RE Vocabulary

Word	Definition
<b>The Bible</b>	The Holy Book of Christianity.
<b>Eucharist</b>	A ritual that takes place in churches to remember Jesus' sacrifice to human beings by eating bread and drinking wine to represent Jesus' body and blood.
<b>Gospels</b>	The Books of the New Testament that tell the story of Jesus' life and teachings.
<b>The New Testament</b>	The part of the Bible that tells the story after the birth of Jesus Christ.
<b>Resurrection</b>	How Jesus was brought back to life after his death.
<b>Sacrifice</b>	To give up something for someone else.
<b>Salvation</b>	To be saved from harm.



Christians remember Jesus' sacrifice for them every time they take the **Eucharist** / Holy Communion.
