A home is a safe place to live. It needs, shelter, energy, food, warmth, connection to towns, roads and power supplies.



Word	Definition
Natural resources	Resources that exist without any actions of humankind. e.g. land, and vegetation.
Refugee	A person forced to leave his or her home/country to seek safety and protection.
Asylum seeker	A person who has left their home country as a political refugee and is seeking asylum in another.
Migrant	A person who moves from one place to another in order to find work or better living conditions.
Immigrant	A person who comes to live permanently in a foreign country
Inhabitants	A person that lives in a place.
Displaced	A person who has to leave their home, because of war, persecution, or natural disaster.
Sanctuary	A refuge or a place of safety.
Values	An important standard of behaviour in life.
Community	A group of people with a shared space and interests .
Destination	A place to which someone is being sent.
Settlement	A place where someone might live.
Economic activity	A person providing goods or services.
Conflict	A serious disagreement.
