Countries near the **Equator** are very hot. Countries far away, for example the **North Pole** at the top and the **South Pole** at the bottom of the Earth are very cold.

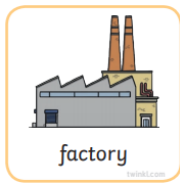
Physical Features like sea, mountains and rivers are **natural**. They would be here even if there were no people around.

Word	Definition
Continents	The world is divided into seven continents: Europe; Asia; North America; South America; Africa; Australasia; and Antarctica.
Oceans	There are five oceans in the world: Atlantic Ocean; Arctic Ocean; Indian Ocean; Pacific Ocean; and Southern Ocean.
The Equator	The Equator is an imaginary line around the middle of the Earth.
North Pole	the point on the Earth's surface that is furthest north from the equator
South Pole	the point on the Earth's surface that is furthest south from the equator
Human Feature	Human features like houses, roads and bridges are things that have been built by people.
Physical Feature	Physical features like seas, mountains and rivers are natural.



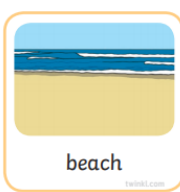

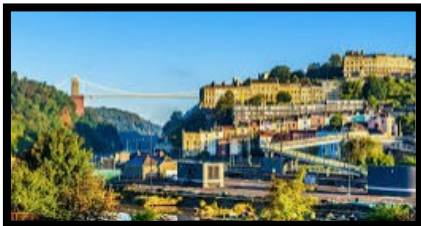

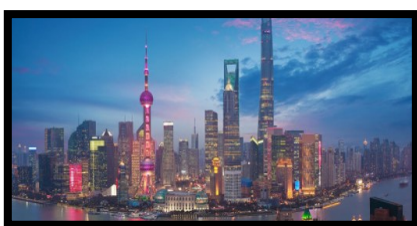
